Set in 12th century England, the narrative concerns the building of a cathedral in the fictional town of Kingsbridge. The ambitions of three men merge, conflict and collide through four decades during which social and political upheaval and the internal politics of the church affect the progress of the cathedral and the fortunes of the protagonists. Much of the language in this novel as well as the psychology of the characters and their relationships remains firmly rooted in the 20th century.
